<b>Course Aims</b>
To read widely and critically (to improve own writing), write effectively and coherently using Standard English (inc. spelling, grammar and punctuation), acquire a broad vocabulary alongside knowledge of grammatical terminology, and linguistic conventions for reading, writing and spoken language, understand and use spoken Standard English effectively.
<b>Course Description</b>
Students will read selections from a range of high-quality, challenging prose fiction, in preparation for responding to an unseen 19th-century prose fiction extract in their examination. They will read substantial pieces of writing (extended texts) that make significant demands on them in terms of content, structure and the quality of language. Throughout the qualification, students will develop the skills of inference, analysis and evaluation. Students will use what they have learned about the writer's craft in their reading of fiction to inspire and influence their own imaginative writing. They will develop a range of creative writing techniques, including planning and proofreading skills.
<b>Main topics covered</b>
Fiction and imaginative writing Non-fiction and transactional writing

This qualification prepares students for progression to further study of English Language at AS and A level and to the study of AS and A level English Language and Literature.
